<b>Salary</b>	Main Scale + SEN 1
<b>Purpose</b>	Teaching of Maths as an examination subject and supporting the development of numeracy across the school curriculum
<b>Responsible to</b>	Assistant Head – Curriculum and Teaching & Learning
<b>Responsible for</b>	Effective running of the Maths and Numeracy aspects of the College Curriculum

### Main duties and responsibilities

#### **1. Teaching**

To support the development, design and implementation of a broad balanced curriculum that includes Maths, English/Numeracy & Literacy

- To work closely with colleague co-ordinators to develop joint planning and joint themes so that the curriculum is joined up and makes sense to students
- To continually review opportunities for accreditation of students’ achievement
- To advise and co-operate with the Headteacher and other teachers on the preparation and development of courses of study, teaching materials, teaching schemes, methods of teaching and assessment and pastoral arrangements
- To be a role model for students and colleagues
- To create a vibrant learning environment
- To manage resources effectively
- To embrace a wide range of learning styles
- To plan and prepare schemes of work and complete planning documentation
- To teach, according to their educational needs, the students in your class, including the setting and marking of work to be carried out by the students in school and elsewhere
- To plan and supervise activities to be carried out by Teaching Assistants in the classroom in support of student learning
- To have an understanding of the particular challenges which students with severe and

complex social, emotional, and mental health difficulties encounter

- To accept overall responsibility for all aspects of internal and external assessment
- To assess, record and report on the development, progress, and attainment of the students in your class
- To provide or contribute to oral written, photographic, and video assessments, reports and references relating to individual students and groups of students Public Examinations
- To participate in arrangements for preparing students for public examinations
- To assess students for the purposes of such examinations and recording and reporting such assessments
- To participate in arrangements for students' presentation for and supervision during such examinations
- To participate in arrangements for the appraisal of your own performance
- To participate in arrangements for the appraisal of Teaching Assistants you are responsible for
- To participate with further training and professional development
- To keep under review your methods of teaching and programmes of work; and participate in arrangements for your further training and professional development as a teacher

## **2. Curriculum**

- To select, develop and implement a curriculum based on current GCSE Specification
- To design, develop and implement a curriculum which will address the needs of students in KS3 to ensure the sound development of their confidence in numeracy skills and lead to effective foundation for learning at KS4
- To work closely with My Foundation Co-ordinator and the other Curriculum Co-ordinators to develop an awareness of how numeracy may be promoted in all areas of the curriculum
- To continually review opportunities for accreditation of students' achievement
- To advise and co-operate with the Head Teacher and other teachers on the preparation and development of courses of study, teaching materials, teaching schemes, methods of teaching and assessment and pastoral arrangements
- To take responsibility, under the direction of the Curriculum Co-ordinator, for a specific teaching area: i.e. numeracy
- To contribute to our social curriculum (e.g. informal activities) drawing on your subject specialism
- To participate in, and lead when appropriate, innovative cross-curriculum projects aimed at disaffected young people to engage them in learning

### **3. Assessment Recording & Reporting**

- To assess, record and report on the development, progress and attainment of the students in your class
- To provide or contribute to oral written, photographic and video assessments, reports and references relating to individual students and groups of students

### **4. Public Examinations**

- To participate in arrangements for preparing students for public examinations
- To assess students for the purposes of such examinations, and record and report such assessments
- To participate in arrangements for students' presentation and supervision during such examinations

### **5. Appraisals**

- To participate in arrangements for the appraisal of your own performance
- To participate in arrangements for the appraisal of other teachers and Teaching Assistants

### **6. Further Training and Professional Development**

- To keep under review your methods of teaching and programmes of work; and participate in arrangements for your further training and professional development as a teacher

### **7. Behaviour Management, Health and Safety**

- To promote the philosophy and school ethos of building trusting, safe, consistent relationships between students and staff and students and their peers
- To be able to hold firm boundaries with students, encourage them to make positive choices and engage them successfully in resolving conflict and other issues which may impede their learning and/or social and emotional development
- To safeguard their health and safety when they are authorised to be on the school premises and when they are engaged in authorised school activities elsewhere

### **8. Staff Support**

- To participate in meetings at the school which relate to the curriculum for the school or the administration or organisation of the school, including pastoral arrangements
- To engage in school supervision – group and individual
- To participate and lead seminars

<b>9. Communication</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To communicate and consult with the parents of students, or others who have a legitimate interest in the students in your class</li> <li>To communicate and co-operate with persons or bodies outside the school; and participate in meetings arranged for any of the purposes described above</li> </ul>	
<b>10. Cover</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To supervise, and so far as is practicable teach, any students whose teacher is not available to teach them, when required</li> </ul>	
<b>11. General Professional Duties</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To carry out particular duties as reasonably be assigned to you by the Head Teacher</li> <li>To contribute to the overall life and work of the school</li> </ul>	
<b>12. Management and Administration</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To participate in administrative and organisational tasks related to such duties as are described above</li> <li>To manage the budget for Numeracy within the My Passport area of the curriculum</li> </ul>
